Overview: Chico High School is a four-year, two semester comprehensive high school accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges and is one of the two comprehensive secondary schools in the Chico Unified School District. Community: Chico is an agricultural, commercial, cultural, economic, and educational center of the Northern Sacramento Valley. Home to California State University, Chico hosts nearly 20,000 university students during the academic school year.

COVID-19 Response: Schools in our district transitioned to distance learning on March 23, 2020, and remained in an online-only instructional model until October 19, 2020. In October 2020, we implemented a bell schedule with separate attendance cohorts – one in the morning and another in the afternoon. For the 2021-22 school year, our students returned on campus to a new 8-period daily attendance model. We navigated state COVID-19 protocols for in-person instruction including contact tracing and notifications of the need to quarantine as a result.

Science Curriculum: Chico Unified School District has adopted California Next Generation Science Standards and began offering Biology – The Living Earth during the 2022-2023 school year, and added Chemistry in the Earth System and Physics of the Universe this academic year, 2023-2024. These courses have replaced our previously offered; Biology, Chemistry, and Physics.

College Connection: Chico High School has a cooperative arrangement with the local colleges that allows our students to enroll concurrently in college classes. College Connection is a partnership with participating school districts to provide high school seniors the option of spending their senior year at Butte College. Students complete high school requirements through a combination of class time and independent studies while enrolled in Butte College classes.

High School Scholars: The High School Scholars (HSS) program is an opportunity for high school students to take up to two courses at CSU, Chico. The objective of the program is to offer service-area students access to college courses not offered in high school.

Grading and Credits: Progress reports are made available online at the 6th and 12th weeks of both semesters. Parents have access to daily attendance, discipline, class assignments, and final report cards through the online program, Aeries Student Information Systems. Grade Point Averages are computed on a 4.0 scale. A=Excellent; B=Above Average; C=Average; D=Below Average (credit earned); F=Failure. AP courses and selected honors courses are weighted on a 5.0 scale. Students earn five credits per class for each semester. Students are not ranked.

Rank in Class: Chico High School does not report individual rank in class, but we do provide decile distribution. Cumulative ranking based on GPA does not adequately represent our students' actual achievement.
